To join forces and create synergies, we work with (philanthropic) alliances towards systemic change. We strengthen the agency of affected groups and support transformative collaborations between actors from different sectors of society.

Our funding in West and East Africa focuses on strengthening civil society actors, the participation of marginalized voices in national and international processes and strengthening African positions and perspectives in cooperation with Germany and Europe. Key countries in our funding strategy are currently Kenya, Senegal and Niger.

The role:

As part of the Climate Change team, you will work on the development and implementation of the impact-oriented funding strategy in West and East Africa, also at the intersection with other topics of the foundation.

Specifically, your responsibilities will include:

- Development and responsible management of complex funding portfolios (set up of project partnerships and relationship management, joint conception of design and content of projects, budget planning and controlling, administration and project management, monitoring, evaluation and learning)
- Processing funding requests and applications
- Representation and promotion of the Foundation's work on the topic of climate change internally and externally

The requirements:

- Relevant academic background with reference to the topics of climate change and land use
- Several years of internationally-focused professional experience with thematic and practical relevance and proven experience in project management
- Very good professional networks
- Good knowledge of strategy development methods
- Administrative and commercial skills as well as advanced written and spoken communication skills
- Take pleasure in communication, teamwork and co-creative processes
- Extensive international experience living and working abroad, preferably in West or East Africa
- Professional fluency in English; good knowledge of German and willingness to

- Cultivating a professional network in Germany and internationally
- further develop language skills if necessary; French and other foreign languages are considered advantage
- Willingness to travel for work within Germany and abroad
